- demographic aspects of retirement (life expectancy, differential mortality, conjugal behavior...),
- the labour market, end-of-career and retirement (career paths, ageing workforce, health at work, arduous jobs, employment of older workers, working in retirement, employer behavior and early retirements...),
- retirement behaviour,
- eligibility conditions according to professional status (employees, civil servants, self-employed workers...),
- macroeconomic modelling of the financing of retirement systems,
- microsimulation modelling of pensions and ageing,
- inequalities in retirement and ageing (inter and intra-generational inequalities, gender issues...),
- savings, assets and preferences,
- living conditions of pensioners, residential mobility, housing conditions, entry into nursing homes, isolation,
- social participation, sharing of domestic work within households,
- ageing and health,
- financing and provision of long-term care,
- impacts of reforms.

The selection of contributions will be based on a complete paper.
